Pastor Mat's Musings

Good day church family! I am excited to begin writing monthly musings in our Christian Visitor. This section will be a reflection on current events, culture, theology and the like. My hope is to explore relevant topics to our local community and the world at large. I also hope to engage these topics with a perspective of attempting to learn more about God. The topic will vary month to month with some being more serious than others. I am starting off this week with a "light" topic, but to some Cubs and Cardinals fans this might hit close to home.

As many baseball fans in the region know, this week (specifically the $31^{\rm st}$) is Major League Baseball's trade deadline. If you are a Cubs or Cardinals fan, you have probably been keeping in touch with the trade rumors as your team needs help for their final playoff push. While the rumors are fun to read about, it is even more fun to ask what the baseball trade deadline can teach us about God. Learning about God through new, unexpected avenues represents one of the strongest elements of a $21^{\rm st}$ century faith. Here is one way this week's trade deadline helps us to learn more about who God is.

This week's trade deadline helps us to understand what drove God to become an active participant in humanity (i.e. why Jesus became human). The trade deadline does something unique to a baseball fan. The trade deadline transforms all baseball fans into baseball savants. Fans are more vocal with their opinions at the trade deadline than at any other time of the year. When the 2017 non-waiver deadline passed without the Astros (my favorite team) adding a starting pitcher, I was fuming. "I work in Christian ministry and even I know what the team needs!" These are the types of thoughts that run through most fans' minds when their team makes a poor decision. Cardinal fans may have felt this when the team low-balled Pujols as a free agent. Cubs fans felt this for 109 years. It is frustrating to love a team and to desperately want what's best for them only to see them make (in the Cubs' case) hundreds of mistakes over and over again.

It hurts to see something you love make the same mistakes continuously. Imagine how God must have felt during the first several thousand years of human history. The Old Testament is riddled with bad decisions made by God's chosen people, the Israelites. Like we feel when our team does not make the trade we know they need, God experienced pain when he saw his children reject him time and time again. But unlike us, God was not helpless in the matter. He decided to not reject or eternally punish his people, but rather to become an active participant providing hope to a broken humanity. He became human, lived a perfect life, and sacrificed his life so that we can be with him again. God was unafraid by the consequences. It surely was not easy to transition from life in heaven to life on earth as a human. Yet, he did this because he knew what was best for us.

By the time you read this, the deadline will have passed. The Cubs and Cardinals more than likely whiffed on the deadline. The frustration mounts as the hopes of a World Series sinks. Use this frustration to relate to God. God loves us far more than we love a baseball team. God created us. Imagine how broken he must feel after we reject him time and time again. The moments where we want to throw our ball caps in the garbage and find a new team are moments for us to remember that in spite of our filthy rags (Isaiah 64:6) God did not throw his "ball cap" and find a new team. He actually joined the team and changed the direction of human history (Philippians 2:6-8). God did something about it. His hurting love led to action. He became human and gave his life so that our "whiffs" can no longer exclude us from relationship with him.


