
First Christian Church is in charge of leading worship at both the Gibson Area Hospital Annex and Heritage Health Care on Sunday, September 15th.

Pastor Mat's Musings

Usually August is full of excitement as the nation eagerly awaits the coming of fall. Families return from their final summer vacation, spring graduates begin their "adulting," teachers finalize their semester curriculum, communities prepare for the onset of football season, and most of all, we ready ourselves for the cool air and colorful leaves of the season. This August, though, was different. August of 2019 will not be marked by the excitement of the coming fall. Rather, this August will be marked by tragedy, confusion, hate, and fear.

The tragedies that occurred in El Paso and Dayton earlier this month left the nation afraid and confused, but we were not surprised. Mass tragedies have become a common occurrence for a modern American. There have been over seventeen mass shootings in 2019. This number is for mass shootings alone. This isn't mentioning the physical and economic devastation of this year's California wildfires. Or what about the low yields predicted for the US corn-belt? Americans are becoming accustomed to disaster, and so often our first response is to post on social media, complain about politics, and play the blame game.

Christians should have a different first response though. Jesus' words found in Luke 13: 1-5 give us a guide as to what our first response to tragedy (of any type) should be. Notice, I am saying first response. This is not the only task of Christians in the face of tragedy. We are also called to be agents of hope and change. Before we can be these agents, we must do something else first.

So what should a Christian's first response to tragedy be? We look to the words of Jesus found in Luke 13: 1-5 for the answer:

13 Now there were some present at that time who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their sacrifices. ² Jesus answered, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? ³ I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish. ⁴ Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? ⁵ I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish."

Jesus here in this passage is asked about two separate tragedies. The first tragedy is a man -made one. Pilate was upset with Galilean Jews for some reason (the text does not give a reason). Weapons were not allowed in the temple. Pilate attacked them as they worshipped, knowing they were at their weakest moment. Therefore, Pilate "mingled" or mixed their blood with that of their sacrifices. The second tragedy was a natural calamity. A tower fell. Ancient architecture was not as sturdy as ours today. Simply, a tower with eighteen people collapsed killing them all.

Jesus' response to the people was trying to convey two messages. The first is that sin is not the cause of tragedy. This was a common view of the time. If something bad happens to you, it must be because you messed up. This was a faulty theology that Christ was condemning here.

The second message is where we find the truth relevant to us today. Your first response to tragedy should always be repentance. The crowd wanted to blame. Christ called for repentance. Repentance is simply the turning of one's self towards God. Many times this turning towards God is in relation to our sin. Sometimes, though, repentance is taking the time in our busy day to acknowledge that God is God.

When tragedy strikes (and it will strike), turn to God. The answers on how to fix the world are BIG. They will not be solved in a short amount of time. They will not be solved in a Facebook post. They will not be solved easily. They will only be solved if you first turn to God. Turn to the creator to fix the creation.


