From the Pastor

When I was a teenager, a friend of mine, who lived a block over, would invite me to go with him to these Youth for Christ rallies on Friday nights. These rallies were held in a stuffy auditorium on Rainbow Boulevard over in Kansas City, Kansas, a stuffy, old auditorium filled with teenagers. And the preacher would go on and on for what seemed like hours. He would be preaching about sin, teenage sin, and about how we should all repent, how we should all repent, or else. And how we should all come forward. We should all come to the front of the auditorium, weeping because of our sins, sorry for them, and repenting.

But, you know, I was a pretty good kid. I wasn't doing any of the things from which that preacher was urging me to repent. Besides which, I went to church every Sunday with my family. And what was this friend of mine thinking? He knew I went to church and was a good kid. Why did he think I needed to repent? Why did he want me to go to these rallies?

And, for the longest time after that, whenever I heard the word repent, I would think of that auditorium, all hot and sweaty. I would think of all of these terrible sins about which I should feel horrible. And weeping and being terribly sorry for something but never being quite sure what. That word repent would trigger all sorts of sad and uncomfortable images in my mind.

And the season is Lent is upon us. It is a season of repentance. A somber season in the church year, Lent is. A time to repent.

But I've learned a few things since then. I've learned that the word repent simply means turn, turn around. And I've learned that, when Jesus called people to repent, he didn't add the words "from sin". He preached that the kingdom of God has come near to us. The kingdom of God, the goodness and love of God, is near you, is right behind you. All you need to do is turn around. And there it is, the goodness and love of God.


So, let this season of Lent, this season of repentance, be a time for us to simply turn, to turn to God, who is all goodness and love.
