A PASTOR'S PONDERING

It doesn't seem possible that we're talking about Christmas already! But it's going to be here in less than a month. Many of you have been involved with our Advent worship series entitled, "Angels Among Us: Do Not be Afraid!" Each week we explore a different angelic visitation story. Last week we discovered how an angel appeared to Zechariah and said, "Make ready a people: more hope." This week we'll enter the story of Gabriel's appearance to Mary who said, "Nothing is impossible: more peace." In coming weeks, we'll encounter the angelic message of "Do not be afraid: more joy," and then, "This will be a sign: more love." Through it all will run the thread of the angelic message, "Do not be afraid!"

Fear is so often a stumbling block for us on our spiritual journey. Fear will sap us of hope, of peace, of joy, and of love. That's why the angels' messages always begin with "Do not be afraid!" Fear is a "little death," because it robs us of living fully. In this holy season of Advent, we're making preparation to receive the Christ Child by getting rid of this fear that doesn't serve us. That's our spiritual work over the next few weeks. We anticipate the time when we won't be imprisoned by fear anymore.

When Christmas comes, everything will be different! When Jesus was born, Matthew tells us, "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." Matthew doesn't say, "will see," or that light "will dawn." When Christ is born, it's already happened! Christmas is all about having more hope, more peace, more joy, more love — and more life. Christmas is all about living fully in the light. No more waiting! Each year we have the privilege of bringing Jesus bodily into the world and into our midst. We don't just remember Christ's birth; we live that event in our here-and-now. At Christmas God is with us. Not just in our memory — not just in a spiritual sense — but physically here. That's a miracle.

This week, we'll explore the question: What are we bringing into the world? It's a question that gets to the heart of our discipleship because, as followers of Jesus, we're called to bring the Good News into the world. Advent is the time for us to prepare to bring something of him into the world. Christmas is so much more than just pretty angels and pretty concepts of "peace on earth" and "good will." It's so much more than just homecoming and family. Christmas is when we embody those angelic concepts. Christmas is when we bring Christ into the world. That, of itself, is a beautiful thing, but it's also a bit scary. It's a time of becoming for us. At Christmas, we become the body of Christ as we live into the embodiment of Jesus. We not only celebrate him, we especially bear him. We bring him. We present him from our own lives. That's a hefty responsibility for us! As Christians it can be our greatest privilege and our finest hour.

When Christmas comes, will we be ready to bring Christ into the world? Will we be ready to bring hope, and peace, and joy, and love? When Christmas comes, will we bring our whole selves into the world — selves free from the shackles of fear? I pray we will!

May it be so! May it be so for us!
