A PASTOR'S PONDERING

Here we are in the middle of Lent — a word that means "spring season." Being surrounded as we are by farms, we know that spring is a season when new growth begins. The soil is fertilized, turned, and seeds planted. It's during spring when things are prepared to come to new life.

It's that way for our faith-life, too. Lent is the time for us to take stock of our lives, to prepare ourselves for resurrection — newness of life. It's in the midst of this time of reflection, introspection, and contemplation that First Christian Church will turn our soil to prepare for new life together.

Our Leadership Retreat will happen in just three weeks, the day before Palm Sunday. This is when our imaginations, hopes, and dreams (fertilized by our creativity and an active prayer life!) will plant the seeds for our future together. All officers, board members, and elders are requested to be in attendance. Other church members are, of course, welcome to attend and weigh in.

I've often thought that the best thing a church can do in planning and implementing programs, ministries, and its common life, is to learn to say, "Yes!" No matter what. In saying "Yes," we create a positive energy shift that's welcoming, warm, and genuine. It's an energy that's hospitable and inviting. It's an energy that says, "We crave connection with you." It's an energy that seeks to build true community through right relationship. It's an energy that honors the "other." It's an energy that encourages us to give up the best of ourselves in ministry to others, creating safe space where questions can be asked, and where hopes, fears, and dreams can be shared.

I wonder: to what things can we say, "Yes?" What ideas might be nourished if we did so? What closely-held wants, needs, and wishes might be fostered if we did so? What visions and dreams might be birthed if we did so? As we meet together to see visions and dream dreams, I hope the spirit of "Yes!" will energize our creativity, and embolden our hearts.

As we prepare ourselves for this vital event, I hope you'll spend time in contemplating one important question: "Why?" Why are we here? Why do we do what we do? Why do we seek to form holy community? Why do we seek to minister to others? Why does this town need us? Why do we gather around the Table each week to learn, and sing, and pray, and celebrate, and contemplate? Why is this spiritual household important? Once we entertain the "whys," the "whats" for which we plan will come into much better focus.

I hope you'll contemplate the "why" as we prepare. If you have an answer that resonates with you, communicate that answer to our leadership, either in writing, or with your presence with us on April 1. Together, we will have the mind of Christ as we discern our future.

May it be so! May it be so for us!

Easter Breakfast & Egg Hunt Sunday, April 9th


