### A PASTOR'S PONDERING

The General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) will meet in Louisville July 29-Aug 1. The General Assembly meets every two years. We've missed being together in person the last two years, due to Covid restrictions. We're excited about being able to gather with friends again to renew church ties. Lisa and I will be in attendance as your voting delegates. I hope you'll pray, not only for us, but for the Assembly and the Church, and for the business we'll conduct that week.

The theme this year is, *Kindom of God Within Us*, *Among Us*. No, that's not misspelled! It's intentionally spelled "Kin-dom" rather than "kingdom." We are increasingly referring to God's realm as a "kindom" in our congregations, because we want to emphasize the unity, the equity, and the kinship of all God's people. Many congregations and ministers have substituted "kin-dom" for "kingdom" in the Lord's prayer. We pray, "Thy kin-dom come." In other words, we pray for the health and expansion of the family of God. I'm excited to see what resolutions we will pass in the general church to further that kinship!

You all know by now that I often emphasize that "God dwells in the spaces between us." If we want to find God in our lives, we must look to the right relationships we form, because it's within those relationships that we may most fully see God. Right relationships are those that are built on a foundation of love. We understand God to be love and so, if it's true that we're created in God's image, we are created in, through, and for love, and it is love that we most fully reflect in the world, and our relationships are "right" when they foster love.

Did you know that "love" appears over 700 times in the Bible? Love is an important spiritual concept. The preponderance of the 613 Levitican Laws are based on love for family, love for one's community, love for the stranger and the vulnerable, and love for God. It's only because of love that we're able to form and maintain relationships that feed us. That's why I believe that God is the head of a "kin-dom." Because love doesn't build a hierarchy, love builds equitable relationships. Jesus said, I don't call you "servant" any longer, but "brother." When asked what was the most important Law, Jesus replied, "Love God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. And love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets depend upon these two." Love is important to Jesus. He hoped that, as the church grew, people would say of it, "See how they love each other!"

So, when we Disciples gather, we often consider and debate issues centering around justice, peace, equity, and inclusion. It's important to us to build and foster the kind of relationship in the world in which every person is seen and respected as a beloved daughter or son of God. In our denomination, outward appearances aren't cause to be excluded, but rather to be celebrated. We consider civic initiatives that seek to hinder that diversity and inclusion, and we speak out against them. And we join with other denominations in the efforts to build a more equitable and welcoming world.

The driving force behind my own ethics is what I call "playground politics." I believe that everyone should be allowed to join in the game. Each one should be treated fairly and should be given the same consideration as everyone else. That's one reason why I love this church. That's why I use inclusive language. That's why I speak of God in non-sexual terms. That's why I promote right relationship so often. Because I believe that it grieves God's heart when people are excluded — for whatever reason! I believe that God loves each one unconditionally, and offers grace to each one unconditionally. So, know that I will vote for inclusive policies and initiatives. I will support actions that promote equity and unity among humankind. I will always err on the side of unconditional love.

As General Assembly time draws near, I hope you'll consider the nature of God, the nature of love, and seek ways in which we, as a community of faith, can best reflect the love of God in our community and in our world. I hope we'll find ways to establish the "kin-dom" of God within us and among us.
