A PASTOR'S PONDERING

Fall is my favorite season. For me, it's always signified a new start. Maybe it's because the new school year always began in the fall with new classes and new opportunities, but somehow the cooler weather, the smell of leaves and wood smoke, the appearance of pumpkins and other decorations always speak to me of beginnings.

Normally we think of fall as a "winding down" season. We begin to move indoors, the days are shorter, the sun not so bright as it has been. Fall begins the "dark days" of the year. Fall marks a time for coming home, a time for harvesting what the year has brought us, and a time to reflect and take stock of where we've been and where we find ourselves.

However, in the midst of all that, there's a silver thread of hope — a feeling of anticipation that's not misplaced. Because we've just come off a season in which we tend to put our industry "on hold" while we barbecue, swim, relax, and revel in the warmer weather. Now it's time to put on our long pants and boots and resume our industry. It really is a "both/and" kind of thing, isn't it?

With the fall comes a call to us, whispered in the drying leaves rustling in the breeze, wafted to us in the particular odors of autumn, placed on our tables with our harvest. We're called to awaken to a different kind of vision than we've had from behind our summer sunglasses. We're called to pay attention to life as it unfolds before us. We're called to pay attention to our interior lives in a way that's different from the way we treat ourselves in summer-time. Somehow, fall creates and holds space for us to get busy in our spiritual growth.

Toward that end, I'd like to offer a workshop of sorts — an ongoing learning group that will help us get in deeper touch with God and with our interior lives. It will offer the learning of a more contemplative form of prayer — meditation, reflection, and engaging in intuitive practices that will energize the soul. It's a kind of prayer practice that's rooted in the lives and ministries of the early desert Fathers and Mothers of Christianity. It's a practice that is both ancient and enduring — one that's shared by nearly every other world religion. It's a practice that has many names you may be familiar with: meditation, contemplation, mindfulness, quietude, centering prayer, breath work, and more. These are practices that I have worked with on a daily basis in my personal life, and have taught and worked with others in more "formal" settings. They continue to be beneficial for me and for others who engage in the practices.

If you feel that your prayer life is important, but something seems to be missing, or you somehow feel that there's "more to it" than just "talking to God," if you feel you want to go deeper into your spiritual life, but you just don't know how to go about it, this might be a great way for you to get started. If you've always wondered about the more "mystic" side of faith, but are (rightfully) hesitant to just jump in with practices that might seem a little ... "foreign" to your life of faith, this will be a safe, affirming, and loving place for you to inquire, to take a look, to ask questions, to explore, and to be guided by your pastor, who has spent many years working with these practices in the context of spiritual direction and spiritual formation rooted deeply in the Christian tradition.

As we begin a season that's conducive to reflection and a deepening of our interior lives, this might be a good time for you to begin a deeper journey into your spiritual formation. The invitation is open. This is something that can be done with as few as two or three, or even more. Just let me know if you're interested, and we'll get started.
