A PASTOR'S PONDERING

Our Christian walk, including personal prayer time, worship, Bible study and Christian education, as well as walking our path in the world, is all about our transformation. We move from being asleep to coming awake. In fact, that word, *resurrection* (which we reserve as a sacred term for a sacred act) is, in the Greek of the New Testament, a very <u>common</u> word, used daily by ordinary people. It means simply "to stand up out of bed," or "to come awake." Our resurrection can be a metaphor for our continuing enlightenment as we learn and grow in Christ. The journey we take during the holy season of Lent is a way for us to embody the introspection, the reflection, and the self-examination necessary for clearing ourselves, so that we're ready for the transformation of new life at Easter.

Lent is traditionally about "prayer and fasting," that is, committing to spiritual disciplines designed to help us grow, and becoming more intentional in our faith walk. Traditionally, the faithful would participate in acts of self-denial (like fasting, and abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent). In more modern times, people have "given up" habits that they know hinder their spiritual growth, or things they know aren't good for them. People "give up" soda pop, chocolate, smoking, drinking, and other things, hoping to break bad habits. Those acts of abstinence are great for those who've got bad habits to break. Others of us concentrate our discipline on building habits that are good for us, such as committing to daily schedules of meditation, or looking for ways to be of particular service to others, particularly the less fortunate. Some increase monetary giving. Some commit to being in worship every Sunday.

Lent is a great time to do these things, because the growth that can happen through these intentions and disciplines mirrors the growth that happens in nature in the season of Spring. Building up our spiritual lives means, not only being more intentional about taking on spiritual disciplines, but also about releasing those things that no longer serve us. Lent is what we call a <u>penitential</u> season. That is, a time in which we examine our hearts and consciences, asking forgiveness for things we have done—or even failed to do, and especially forgiving *ourselves* (because we're our own worst critics, after all!).

During worship, you'll be given some time and space to enter the silence of your own hearts in acts of prayer. You'll notice that we engage in a special litany of pardon. You'll notice less talk and more action. You'll notice that Lent takes on a more somber atmosphere, as we focus on what we need to change in order for transformation to happen. This season isn't all about Christ's passion and death — it's not a sad time when we focus on our guilt. Rather, it's an <u>intentional</u> time when we focus on God's forgiveness, and how we can give the gift of forgiveness to ourselves and to each other.

I hope each of you will commit to some greater spiritual involvement this season. You'll find that, as we grow together, we'll become a transformed community once Easter arrives. And that transformation can carry us through new and developing ministries together, as we work to awaken our community to all the ways in which God is at work in our lives.

Come and rest! Come and listen!
