A PASTOR'S PONDERING

We've spent the holy season of Lent so far listening — "listening for that still, small voice, and finding our own." We're going to continue doing that until Easter at the end of this month.

Listening is important. Listening is different from just <u>hearing</u>. When we hear, we perceive sounds and we can differentiate between different kinds of sound. We can perceive differences in volume, tone, timbre, and pitch. We can perceive nuances in intensity. We can even identify sources, and languages, and we can perceive the four elements of a sound: attack, sustain, decay, and release. But hearing is still rather "two-dimensional." That is, hearing represents an <u>objective</u> process, that of perceiving sound waves outside of ourselves, divorced from our being influenced by them in some way. Hearing is important, because it's one way we sense what's happening in the world around us. By hearing, we can quantify the sound waves that come to us. We can analyze and we can derive facts.

But we have to do more than just perceive these two-dimensional things about sounds. We have to learn the art of *listening*. The act of Listening adds *depth* to what we hear by bringing otherwise objective sound waves into the subjective. When we <u>listen</u>, we seek to build a relationship with what we hear — and not only with what we hear, but with the source of the sound and with the meaning behind the sound.

We've all encountered the phrase, "I hear you." It's a way for us to acknowledge that we've received some message from someone. Sometimes we use that phrase as a way of letting the person know just that: that we've acknowledged the receipt of their message. I don't like that phrase, because it's still very objective. It still <u>distances</u> the receiver from the sender. "I hear you" only serves to put up a wall between people. "I'm *listening*" is a far better phrase.

When we <u>listen</u>, we make ourselves vulnerable. When we listen, we open ourselves to being <u>influenced</u> by what we hear. When we listen, we gain *understanding*. When we listen, we inwardly digest what we're hearing. When we listen, we build <u>relationship</u> through the *subjective* process of engaging emotionally. When we listen, we give credence to that which is being heard. It becomes understood and is given respect.

I think much of the time, if we're paying attention, we do <u>hear</u> God. And much of the time, we hold what we hear as two-dimensional and objective information *about* God and God's world. But I wonder how often we really *listen* to God? Do we really make ourselves *vulnerable* to God, and allow ourselves to be <u>influenced</u> — "transformed" — <u>changed</u> by what God has to say? How often do we really *understand* in the depths of our being what God is saying? Are we just holding God out in front of ourselves and making objective, doctrinal statements, or have we taken God *in*, allowing subjective transformation to happen?

Learning the art of listening is, I believe, a prerequisite to living a resurrection life. What we listen to during Lent will change us in ways we can't imagine, and impart to us that new life Jesus promises us. Toward that end, I hope you'll continue to listen, to digest, to make part of you what God speaks into your life as we continue through Lent. I think you'll find that God's still, small voice is in sync with your own, if you open yourself to that possibility.


