#### More in the Life and Witness of the First Christian Church

#### A PASTOR'S PONDERING

This year is a year of prayer for us. I'm beginning a book study on how to build a life of prayer. We're exploring different forms of prayer in the context of our worship. I plan to establish a couple of spaces in our building dedicated to prayer and the communication of prayer needs.

Prayer is important to me, personally, and I think it's important for the Church as a whole. We need to pray! And we need to establish good prayer habits, ways of prayer that are effective for us and that meet our particular spiritual needs.

Many people are a little trepidatious about prayer. "What do I say?" They want to know. "How do I do it?" They ask. "How am I supposed to carve enough time out of my busy schedule to pray every day?" Paul admonishes us to "pray continually." How do we *do* that when we have so many other things vying for our time and attention?

I'd like for you to consider that prayer isn't just a formula of "right words." It can be that, but it's not just that. Prayer is also not simply a sacred activity — something that we feel we have to "do." At its heart, prayer is a *relationship*. Prayer isn't primarily about "carving out bits of time to say the right words." Prayer is *a way of <u>being</u>* in the world. Prayer is the Christian's way of being in the world. Prayer is <u>our</u> way of being in the world.

Really, as Paul teaches us, prayer is Holy Spirit breathing in us. Prayer is spirit that's a vital part of our being — of who we are. We breathe all the time, in and out, as we go about our daily tasks, our entertainment — even our sleep time. If we can breathe without thinking about it, without devoting cognitive space and energy to it, then we can pray without always giving up cognitive space. There are times when we need to be conscious of our petitions to God — times when we have something specific to say to God, or something we need to specifically *listen* for, and those are the times when we engage in specific forms of prayer like supplication, contemplation, or meditation, but the way of continual prayer is not always on the radar of our attention. Many times, prayer is just *how we live life*.

If we intend to live our lives within God, if we intend to see and understand that all life is caught up in God, in fact, could not *exist* without God, if we understand that we are *formed* by prayer, *breathe* prayer, and *live* by prayer, then we <u>are</u> always "in prayer," because we're always connected with God.

When the practice of prayer becomes an expression of who we are in the world, and being true to that expression, then prayer becomes a very life-affirming thing, and as easy as drawing breath, rather than one more item on our "to-do" list for which we have to make room. Because the purpose of prayer is to continue to become more and more the people God made us to be.

As we continue throughout this year to grow in faith, I hope we can expand our awareness of the basic vitality of prayer in our lives, and learn to live more fully into the implications of prayer as our vital breath.

#### May it be so! May it be so for us!
