More in the Life and Witness of the First Christian Church

A PASTOR'S PONDERING

I officiated the memorial service of the mother of one of my friends whom I've known for over 50 years. Carol was like a second mother to me. It was difficult to speak about her, and even more difficult to watch my friend break down periodically in grief.

The morning of the funeral, my friend called me to tell me that his son had awakened him at 2:00 that morning. His wife had gone into labor at their home near Atlanta. The son flew out at 6:00 am, and the baby was born sometime around 9:30. So the mood during the funeral that afternoon was bittersweet. A light had gone out of the world, and a new light was beginning to shine.

At this time of year, when school is beginning and Labor Day marks the end of another summer, when the corn and beans are beginning to turn, I think about the cycles of life — how living turns to dying, and how death comes back to life again in the spring. Life always takes its turns; so far I've made over 64 turns around the sun, and, God willing, I'll take many more.

I can't help but notice the chances and changes that seem to take place on a daily basis. Life is change, and to be alive is to be constantly on the move in some way that serves to keep us fresh. We can count on new experiences and we can also count on some things remaining constant in our lives. Happily, those constants — the things that endure — are those things that are most important. They are things like faith, love, hope. Those things inform our experience of all the other things that do change.

We should remember that life is like a relay race; someone will always pass us the baton, and we, in our turn, will pass it on to someone else. Life will continue. As I mourn the loss of "Mom #2" and grieve alongside my friend, I also have to smile at the new life that is just beginning. I like to think that, perhaps, those two souls passed each other — one on his way to meet us and the other on her way to meet her Lord — that they smiled at each other in recognition, the little one saying, "Don't worry. I've got this." And the elderly one saying, "Yes. You do!"

Even when things seem to be dying, life perpetuates. It perpetuates because the human spirit endures, no matter what. Every time we extend the circle of our experience to include another, our life is increased just a bit. And we should keep in mind that it's those little things we do for and with each other that make all the difference. Those little things are the strong links of the chain of life, linking one life to another, to another, to another.

May it be so! May it be so for us!
